Who's Eligible to Run for Office

Any resident twenty-one years or older who resides in the confines of the 16th Street Neighborhood, as defined above. A resident's name must be placed into nomination for an office by an eligible resident (self-nominations allowed) and seconded by another eligible resident.

Election Voting Procedures

Before the start of the meeting, each attendee will establish eligibility by signing in at the registration desk with their name and address. Eligible residents will then be given ballots for each executive office and the DCRA resolution. Beginning with the position of Chair, nominations will be taken from the floor.

- Each nomination requires a second from the floor. Once all nominations are in, the Association will present a slate of eligible candidates for that office.
- Each candidate will have an option to present their qualifications for the office, limited to two minutes. After all candidate statements, eligible voters will be asked to write in the name of their choice for the office in question and deposit their ballot in the ballot box.
- Ballots will be counted by two volunteers from amongst the eligible voters present and they will announce the winners. The winning candidates will serve in these roles until the next election at the 2016 Annual Meeting.
- The DCRA resolution will be presented for a YES or NO vote and the results announced by the vote counting team.

Over 85 residents turned out to hear Lt. Raul Figueras, who has day-to-day responsibility for PSA 404 (our neighborhood), address our community's concerns about crime and safety.

Lt. Figueras Reported:

- MPD has deployed more officers to PSA 404, including an overtime detail to increase police presence;
- Two survey units dedicated to driving through neighborhood streets/alleys;
- Two recent violent crimes have been closed, arrests in both cases:
- Important to call 911 to report all suspicious activity. 911 calls play a significant role in the allocation of police resources;
- Get to know you neighbors;
- Be aware of your surroundings as you walk the neighborhood
- Walk on well-lit, heavily traveled streets with a friend or group when possible.
